Board Items

(Meeting of June 12, 2007)

Budget The Board adopted the proposed budget for 2007-2008. There will be no increase in the tax rate of \$330 per \$1,000 of assessed valuation this year. There will be an increase of \$10 in the refuse charge, to \$350. Projected income and expenses are expected to rise by \$19,000. The total Village budget will be \$668,000.

Police Commissioner Bates reported that the two dog problems had been resolved. The Town of Brookhaven mandated that one dog be put down and the other died of natural causes. There have been several instances of vandalism to the Village gate and unauthorized use of the Village Beach. Closer monitoring of the area will be undertaken.

Roads Recent flooding of Village drains has been surveyed by Village Engineer Falasco. Several residents spoke regarding flooding on Beatty Road and ineffective drains on Gridley. When work is done on the Beatty Road problem, it is hoped that the status of the Village South/North drain can be ascertained.

Parks Commissioner Morris reported plans for planting, particularly replacing maples in the playground area with shade trees which are not susceptible to the disease that is felling the maples.

Village Hall Rentals The Board approved Village Hall rentals for June 24 and July 28, 2007.
