Board Items

(Meetings of October 9 and November 13, 2007)

Trustee Ingoldsby Mayor Klatsky has received the resignation of Trustee Timothy Ingoldsby due to business obligations. These prevent him from attending Village Board meetings. The Board expressed its regret at his leaving and thanked him for his many contributions to the Village.

In accordance with Village Law, Mayor Klatsky appointed Edward Weiss to fill this position. Due to potential conflict of interest, Mr. Weiss will resign his position on the Zoning Board of Appeals. Replacements are being considered.

Roads Commissioner Kogel reported that drainage work is being performed in many areas of the Village. On behalf of the residents, he thanked Legislator Marc Alessi, who secured a \$70,000 Multi-Modal Fund Grant for the Village. The curb work and paving of Overhill Road will be delayed until warmer weather in the Spring.

Village Hall Commissioner Scrimenti reported on the installation of the new front door. The Board approved the appointment of Hal Anastasia as Deputy Commissioner of Village Hall Operations. The Commissioners are also looking into replacing the chairs in the upper level and the exterior doors to the lower level in the Village Hall. The Board approved the re-keying of the Village Hall at a cost not to exceed \$2,500.

Design Review Fee Commissioner Willen was appointed to collect the specified fee prior to work of the Design Review Board on new building permit applications.

Recreation Commissioner Pijacki reported that some of the beams under the platform tennis facility are rotting after forty years. She is investigating a

program to gradually replace them. Drainage has become a problem after heavy rains on the clay tennis courts. Commissioner Pijacki will investigate and report back to the Board on renovation costs. LIPA will provide used telephone poles to replace those used at the ball field for safety purposes. The Board authorized Clerk Bates to sign the LIPA agreement.

Shoreham Village Association The Board approved the Shoreham Village Association's request to prepare bid specifications for organic lawn care of the Village playground. Once this has been prepared, the lawn care will be bid and costs evaluated.

The Village Association agreed to revise its brochure about the Village and to resume the greeting of new residents as it has in the past.

Respite Home Mayor Klatsky reported on the informational meeting held on November 5, 2007. The responsible parties have promised to abide by Village laws and to exercise better control. Residents were given a phone number to call in case of a problem.

Village Hall Rentals The Board approved a Village Hall rental for August 2, 2008. A charity rental was also approved for an open mid-November Friday date. Members of the Board agreed to personally subsidize a portion of the rental fee. The Board also approved a rental to the R. P. Fire Dept. at a reduced rate of \$2,000 for an open date in December.
