Board Items

(Meetings of September 8, October 13, November 10, and December 8, 2009 and January 12, 2010. Hearing of September 22, 2009 and Workshops of January 9 and 16, 2010)

Village Justice The Board is pleased to announce that Barbara Kullen has agreed to become the new Village Justice.

Village Hall The final payment on the bond for the Village Hall has been made. This happy circumstance should make money available for the accumulated repairs and maintenance tasks necessary at the Hall.

The Board asked Commissioner Scrimenti to have a structural engineer examine the Village deck and its railing and to advise as to its safety and any needed repairs. The Board convened a workshop to examine this and the list of needed projects at the Village Hall. Under the guidance of Commissioner Scrimenti they prioritized the projects for execution over several years.

Recreation Commissioner A. Pijacki reported that the repair of the heaters at the paddle tennis courts has been completed by G. Tastrom. Alterations were needed to bring the heaters up to code by installing heat shields and some copper pipe.

Beach Discharge Environmental Commissioner Emma will head a committee to look into the storm water discharge on the beach. A proposal for a grant to install a water quality device and for storm water improvements was prepared by Engineer Falasco. The Board approved its submission.

Roads The Board convened a workshop with Commissioner Kogel and Engineer Falasco to prioritize the road repairs and drainage projects needed in the Village. The projects were then planned over multiple years.

Security Commissioner Flannery requested an extension for the security day shift beyond September 15th. The Board approved his request to the third week of October. Security patrols have been rescheduled to include some daytime hours during the Winter. Village Justice Kullen and Commissioner Flannery will be discussing the issuance of parking tickets and holding a Village court.

Village Website Webmaster Oberdorf has been updating the Village website regularly. Residents are urged to look at it, especially added historical information.

Parkland The Parklands Committee submitted a plan for the near term maintenance of the Village parklands. Several residents have committed to demonstrating the viability of removing invasive plants by hand, without the use of herbicide, by late Spring. Then a more comprehensive plan will be developed.

The parkland at Prospect Street is scheduled for cleanup during the winter months. In addition hazardous brush and trees along several Village roadways will be removed.

Fire Contract The contract with the Rocky Point Fire District is expected to receive final approval soon.

Hearing A Hearing was held on the dangerous conditions at 119 Briarcliff Road. The owner agreed to take all measures the Village specified in order to secure the premises. Satisfactory action has been taken by the owner.

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Village Hall Rentals The Board approved Village Hall rentals for November 21, December 5, 2009 and February 7, March 7, March 20, April 17, April 24, May 29, June 5, June 12, June 24, July 10, July 31, August 14, August 21, August 28, September 18, October 16, and October 23, 2010. A number of these rentals are for community groups using the lower level.

Notices

Road Right of Ways Residents are reminded that 7.5 feet of width (more on many streets) along their street frontage is road right-of-way. This area should be kept in a neat and non-hazardous condition by the resident

Tree Law Residents are reminded of the Village Tree Ordinance prohibiting the removal of more than 3 large trees per year Those with questions may call the Building or Parks Commissioner for clarification.
