

Board Items

(Meeting of June 10, 2008)

bulkhead work on the Weiss property on Briarcliff Road.

Budget The Board adopted the proposed budget for 2008-2009. There will be no increase in the tax rate of \$330 per \$1,000 of assessed valuation this year. There will be an increase of \$19 in the refuse charge, to \$369. Projected income and expenses are expected to decrease by \$1,100. The total Village budget will be \$666,900.

Election Incumbent Mayor Wilbur Klatsky and incumbent trustees Weiss, Willen and Falco were reelected to office. 217 residents cast their ballots. Mayoral results were Mr. Klatsky – 131, Mr. Bates – 69. There were several write-in votes cast for trustee.

Archives A committee was formed to look into making digital copies of old Village records, particularly minutes. Early minutes are deteriorating, yet contain valuable information. Some was recently found to clarify a question for the Board of Trustees. Committee members are R. Pijacki, P. Spier, M. Oberdorf and D. Madigan.

Respite Home East End Disabilities will be hosting an open house for neighbors in the future. A neighbor of the respite home on Circle Drive inquired about Village ordinances specific to rentals. Brookhaven Town requires a rental license assuring that the Town is aware of possible rentals. She also suggested that one of the licensed brokers living in the Village monitor MLS as to appropriateness of advertising for homes in the Village.

Village Hall Rentals The Board approved Village Hall rentals for June 8, September 6, and September 27, 2008.
