Board Items

(Meeting of June 11, 2013)

Budget After a public hearing the Board adopted a revised budget for 2013-2014. There will be an increase in the tax rate from \$392 to \$409 per \$1,000 of assessed valuation this year which includes the additional funding needed for the transfer of snow removal costs from the Town of Brookhaven to the Village budget. Without the snow removal costs, the Village budget increase is 2%. There will be no change in the refuse charge of \$311.

Election Trustees Len Emma and Brian Vail were elected to office.

Hearings After hearings, the Board approved a 180-day extension of the Moratorium on Subdivisions and a local law permitting authorization to override the 2% tax cap. A Hearing on July 9th was scheduled for a Law providing for a Temporary Moratorium on Demolitions until such time as the revised Zoning Law can be enacted.

Village Hall Rentals The Board approved the use of the Village beach by Briarcliff School on June 18th and the use of Village parking by the school on June 14th.

Public Works Commissioner Kogel reported that the water company had found water after drilling to 250 feet. Catch basins will be installed soon. The water main project has completed phase one of three phases. Village roadwork will be addressing the drainage and curbing at the intersection of Woodville and Gridley Roads.

Beach The Board approved the purchase of a boat and motor to replace the safety boat at the Village beach. Work is nearly completed on the stairs and ramp to the beach and the beach road work is progressing.
