

Board Items

(Meetings of April 8, April 29, May 13 and May 24, 2008)

Budget Preparations The Board reviewed the draft budget for the budget year August 1, 2008 to July 31, 2009. The budget highlights are:

1) No change will be made to the tax rate, which will remain at \$330 per \$1000 of assessed valuation.

2) The refuse rate will be increased by \$19 per household to \$369 this new budget year.

3) Revenues and expenses are expected to decrease \$1,100 or approximately 0.2%.

4) Total Village budget will be \$666,900.

The Board considered the draft budget and scheduled a hearing for Tuesday, June 10, 2008 to present the budget to residents. Changes may be made at this hearing.

Village Elections The annual elections of the Incorporated Village of Shoreham will be held in the Village Hall from noon until 9 PM on Tuesday, June 17, 2006.

Positions open and candidates running are:

Trustee Roger Pijacki has one year remaining on his term.

Resignation The Board accepted the unexpected resignation of Village Clerk/Treasurer and Police Commissioner John Bates. He was thanked for his many years of service to the Village. Colleen Piscak was named interim Clerk/Treasurer.

Playground The Board accepted a bid of \$2330 for organic care of the playground area.

Roads Commissioner Kogel reported that \$70,000 in multi-modal funds procured by Legislator Alessi were received in April. Projects scheduled for the Spring are expected to start soon. Additionally a camera will be used to assess the storm water pipe to the Sound if possible. The Board asked that homeowners be notified when work is to be done on their properties in the future.

Storm Water A newsletter has been sent to all residents. Engineer Falasco reported that the Village is making good progress on the mandated Federal/State Phase I and II directives. The Village is still awaiting the \$100,000 multimodal funds that Senator LaValle procured, which will be used for the Spring drain/curb/road work.

Tennis Courts Only one bid was received for the removal of the present clay tennis courts and their replacement with Har-Tru. The bid was \$49,000. Commissioner Pijacki stated there was money in her budget as monies have been placed in Capitol Projects funds over the past several years for this purpose. A final decision on this project was tabled until the Village's financial picture for the coming year is clearer.

Village Hall Rentals The Board approved Village Hall rentals for April 12, May 17, June 21, June 28, July 18, August 8, August 24, October 18, 2008 and April 30, June 27, and June 28, 2009. A Boy Scout Court of Honor was approved for the beach on June 18, 2008 with bathrooms to be available.
