

Shoreham Village Newsletter

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Board Items

(Meetings of July 10, August 14, and September 11, 2007)

Roads Commissioner Kogel reported that curb, drainage and resurfacing work should begin on Overhill Road in the near future using the State \$100,000 grant. With the approval of the Village engineer, the Board approved partial restitution of expenses incurred by a resident who had damage from a malfunctioning Village drain.

Village Hall Commissioner Scrimenti reported that the acoustic group will be meeting soon to receive the report and plan from the acoustical engineer. He stated that some residents desired that the Village Hall be open on weekends. The Board approved if proper supervision could be provided.

Parks Commissioner Morris reported he will be surveying dead trees and will be seeking estimates for their removal. The Board approved the extension of the Village landscaping contract with Priority Landscaping. Priority was asked to clean up an unsightly and neglected Briarcliff Road property. The owner will be billed this expense.

Design Review Board The Board has appointed the new Design Review Board, which replaces the Architectural Review Board. Its chair will be Len Emma with members Barbara Kullen and Linda Weiss. Alternates are Mary Beatty and David Desmond. The Board approved a review fee of \$250 plus reimbursement of expenses.

Currently the DRB is considering a proposal for a cell tower behind the old post office on Woodville Road. This project would need a height variance. Residents will be kept informed.

Zoning Board The Board thanked Richard Strand for his many years of service on the Zoning

Board of Appeals. David Madigan was appointed to the Board to replace Dr. Strand.

Respite Home Mayor Klatsky stated that he hoped an informational meeting with the supervisors of the Respite Home on Circle Drive would be rescheduled. He answered resident's questions as to the home's meeting Village codes. The code allows up to six unrelated persons to reside in a single family residence. Additional information will be shared with residents as it becomes available.

Village Hall Rentals The Board approved Village Hall rentals for July 27, August 11, September 9 and December 27, 2007. Renters will be asked to observe the Village recycling rules when using the Village Hall.

Storm Water Management. Residents are reminded that as leaves fall, all residents have the responsibility to keep their curbsides free of such leaves and other debris. Storm Water Code Enforcement Officer Mike Madigan will advise the Board of violations as required by the Storm Water Management Law.

Parking Residents are reminded to observe Village parking regulations. There is no overnight parking permitted on Village streets. Residents having a social function should ask their guests to all park on the same side of the street so that passage by others or emergency vehicles is not impeded.
