

Board Items

(Meetings of June 22, July 2, July 13, August 10, and September 14, 2010)

Playground Donation The Board accepted an anonymous donation of \$54,000 to be used solely for the renovation of the children's playground.

Annexation Now that the Town of Brookhaven has given its approval, the Board approved the annexation of 77 and 75 Briarcliff Road.

Roads Commissioner Kogel reported that exploratory work will be done on the Village parking lot sink hole. Work on Hillcrest and Beatty Roads has been completed. Bids for roadwork and drainage were received and the low bidder accepted. Drain clean out, erosion repair and apron work is needed throughout the Village as well as continuing work on potholes and drainage.

Recreation Commissioner A. Pijacki thanked all of the many volunteers who assisted with the work on the tennis courts this year.

Parks Attorney Tohill will be asked by the Board to follow up with a Rocky Point resident who has intruded on to parkland and damaged the Village fence. The Board granted permission for a lawsuit if necessary.

Permission was granted for the low bidder (\$3200) to construct a retaining wall of stone around the fire hydrant on Woodville Road to match the existing retaining wall at Major Hopkins Park.

Village Hall Commissioner Scrimenti reported that the renovation of the ladies room is now complete. He expressed concern over problems at the Village gate and on the beach. The Board approved up to \$18,100 to motorize the existing gate and an additional \$5000 for security. The Board approved \$20,000 to be taken from the Capitol Projects reserve for these projects.

Historian Village Historian Oberdorf was granted permission by the Board to participate in several Long Island book projects using photos and historical items from the Village of Shoreham archives. The Board

approved the designation of Peter Spier as **Historian Emeritus**.

Cell Phone Service The Board continues to explore the need to enhance cell phone service in the Village. Residents made it very clear that they wished to be kept informed and hoped that any and all solutions would be looked into, especially those that might not need a tower.

Ethics The Board approved the Code of Ethics proposed by Village Attorney Tohill, citing its consistency with State Village Law.

Appointments The Board accepted the resignation of long time Village Parks Commissioner Tom Morris. Mayor Klatsky thanked him for his many years of service and dedication. The following new commissioners were appointed: Stephen Blum-Buildings & Grounds, James Pase-Assessor, Brian Mahoney-Parks, and Gil Taström-Design Review Committee. The title Police Commissioner was changed to Code Enforcement Commissioner to reflect accepted nomenclature.

Village Hall Rentals The Board approved Village Hall rentals for September 9, October 10, and October 23, 2010 and April 30, May 14, May 21, June 25, and July 9, 2011.

Keep Our Streets Safe As fall approaches residents are reminded of their obligation to keep their curbside free of debris and falling leaves. Vegetation should be trimmed back 3 to 5 feet from the street and corners trimmed so as to maintain safe conditions for drivers. The Village will conduct a survey of all Village roadsides and residents in non-compliance will be notified and given a deadline before Village action and charges.
