Board Items

(Meetings of July 14 and August 11, 2009)

Storm Water Commissioner Emma requested the Board's permission to place a test filter in several drains which go to the Sound. These will allow the Village to determine if bacteria are entering these drains. The Board approved the request.

Medallions to be placed on drains to the Sound have arrived and will be installed soon.

Recreation Commissioner Pijacki reported that in the last year, a great deal of work has gone into repairing and upgrading the tennis courts. Much of the work has been done by volunteers. Special thanks go to Tom Morris, Erich Willen, George Lynn, Roger Pijacki, Butch Guercia, Lee Frei and The Shoreham Village Association. Also assisting were Georgie Lynn, David Pijacki, John Miller, Drew Tyler, Tom Spier, and Randy Goat. Commissioner Pijacki also thanked Mimi Luccio and her volunteers for the restoration at the Bocce court.

There is a major problem under the platform tennis courts with the blowers which must be remediated before needed repairs can be done.

Village Hall Commissioner Scrimenti is putting together a list of needed repairs and maintenance for the Village Hall. This multi-year list will be prioritized and cost estimates determined.

Security Commissioner Flannery requested and the Village approved additional security during the day until mid-September. Non-resident parking and use of Village facilities continues to be a problem. Once again residents were urged to have stickers on their cars and to obtain guest passes as appropriate.

Beach Runoff The Board appointed a committee to look into possible solutions and costs for remediation of runoff from the Village drain which empties on the beach. Committee members include:

Appointments The Board reappointed Linda Weiss to serve on the Design Review Board. Her term will expire in 2012. All other Village appointees were reappointed. Vacancies in Commissioner positions will be filled as soon as possible. The elected position of Village Justice is now vacant due to the untimely passing of Justice Richard Kullen

Village Hall Rentals The Board approved Village Hall rentals for July 31, 2009 and June 5, 2010. Also approved was the use of the east beach on September 13, 2009 for a church social.
