Shoreham Garden Club

The following lists of plants of Chinese ancestry are given to refresh the minds of exhibitors in the Flower Show. Owing to lack of space only a few names are given here, so it must be true that a wealth of material is available in our gardens for this event. Speaking of Chinese flowers and plants, it is to be hoped that none of the Shoreham Garden Club members were discouraged and feel that they are not equal to making exhibits after seeing Mme. Arai's arrangements. It is called to your attention that the arrangements you saw were Japanese. The Chinese people perhaps founded this method of flower arrangement, but the Japanese in adopting it have made a great study of it and developed it to a much higher degree of perfection than the Chinese. The Chinese use simple arrangements of good line and stress their beautiful containers rather than their plant material. Please try to make at least one arrangement in the Chinese manner for our show.

Annuals of Chinese Ancestry:
Aster, Poppy, China Pinks, Centaury (Sweet Sultan), Feverfew, Scabiosa, and Balsams.

Perennials of Chinese Ancestry:
Aconitum (Monk's Hood), Chrysanthemums, Geranium, Anemone, Delphinium Chinensis, Iris, Lilies, Hollyhocks, Hibiscus, Platycodon (Balloon Flower).
Shrubs of Chinese Ancestry:
Abelia, Althea (Rose of Shoran), Buddleia (Butterfly Bush), Cotoneasters, Daphne, Deutzia, Hydrangea, Lilac, Roses, Smoke Tree, Viburnum Fragrans.


