





HORTICULTURE

A garden is a dynamic thing. No matter how carefully chosen as to potential size or local adaptation, its shrubs will keep on growing. In the wild, Nature gives no thought to the maintenance of arbitrary designs or the limits of available space.

In a well ordered garden things are different. Restrictive housekeeping is necessary. Like all housekeeping constant attention to detail will make results imperceptible but pleasing. A system of restrictive pruning put on this basis will make the presence of a number of relatively large shrubs possible in the small garden. With forsythias, spiraeas, philadelphus and other similar Spring-blooming shrubs the process is rather simple. Pruning need consist of not much more than removal of about one-third of the old wood each year.

By doing this thinning out soon as possible after the flowering season, the basal replacements shoots will be able to make a seasonal growth before winter. Annual attention of this sort makes unnecessary any high pruning upon the stems. High pruning of Spring flowering shrubs will lead to bare, best plants of unnatural appearance. Even long neglected plants which have grown out of hand through crowd or faulty pruning, this mild treatment will bring back to symmetry within a few years.

The lilac is another desirable plant which can grow to tall and spread out by suckers, covering too much ground.
