






SHOREHAM COUNTRY CLUB CLAM BAKE //


LUNCHEON & BRIDGE




Beer will be sold at just five-cents a glass, but everything else is free to the members of the Shoreham Country Club and their guests.


SAT. NIGHT DANCE

HORTICULTURE



Phloxes will get away with it if they can. It is not because named varieties of perennial phloxes 'run out' or revert to the type that one hears so many complaints on that score. Rather does it happen from allowing seedlings which always go back, if allowed to persist, to the old purple, to spring up and live. To keep this from happening to your phlox planting remove all flower clusters as soon as the florets fall, so seeds will not have a chance to form. As a further precaution, go over the area following May and either destroy any seedling plants, or put them in a nursery to see how they may develop. Many very fine plants have come from sprouts so it is rather fun to do some of this cultivating of seedlings.

Aluminum sulphate is the chemical often used to produce blue flowers on hydrangeas whose blooms are normally pink. One half to three-fourths of a pound to each square yard of soil surface, or for potted plants three ounces to a pint of water will do.

Shoreham property owners are expected to do their duty and make every effort to kill poison ivy on their property. From now until the fruit forms in the fall is the best time to start doing away with the pests. The surest way is to dig it up by the root. Please let us all cooperate. The End.
