






TUNA TAKE TROUNCING AND VICE VERSA.

HORTICULTURE



Time to be thinking about the lawn: all weeds should be dug up from existing lawns to permit reseed of bare places in September. September is the month for spreading fertilizer on established lawns. Farmingdale recommends 10-6-4 fertilizer 10 lbs to 1000 sq.ft. for this purpose. For lawns on poor soil, nothing is better than a good application of peat moss litter from poultry house floor, one in early Fall, and another right after the snow melts in early Spring through which the new grass will grow.

Lupine seeds can now be sown directly where they are to remain permanently. Plan to cover the seedlings during the Winter, the sooner, the better.

Oriental poppies, Madonna lilies and Iris can be planted now. It is time also to order new daffodils as they do better if planted early in the Fall.

Following up Mrs. Hannahs lecture on Hemerocallis why not make up a list and prepare to get a number of the midsummer blooming hybrids? Her advice about getting them locally is excellent for in that way one may be sure which varieties are doing best in section.




the minute evidences of the poison gives the best results.

I have destroyed a great deal of poison ivy with no ill effects. I pull up the vines, roots and all and burn them. I sometimes wear wear cotton gloves and sometimes nothing. The minute I get through working with the plants, I wash my face and hands thoroughly with yellow laundry soap. After they are dry, I rub them with alcohol. The only time I get poison ivy is when I dig up plants in the woods where there are poison ivy plants that I did not see and do not wash up immediately."
