



* PRACTICE OR ACTUAL AIR RAID *

SENIOR WARDENS - WARDENS - On the sounding of three long blasts of the sirens at the Control Center (Village Clerk's office) and Beckwith Store, you are to go at once to your designated stations and patrol, looking out for fires, damage to roads, and casualties. On finding trouble, go to nearest telephone on your patrol and 'phone the Control Center (Shoreham 2345 or 2324) and return at once to the scene of trouble. The Control Center will send the necessary help.

MESSENGERS - On the sounding of the three long blasts of the sirens, you will report to the Control Center to be placed where most needed.

AMBULANCE UNIT - Report to assigned Stations.

VILLAGE POLICE - You will stand by at Control Center to be sent to any emergency at once.

CHILDREN - Children in need of shelter will proceed to the designated shelters.

CIVILIANS - All other residents not designated for duty will remain indoors, away from windows, and all houses are to be blacked out until the all clear. No traffic will be allowed to move, except those on official duty and then only with shielded lights.






WHAT TO DO WHEN AN AIR-RAID ALARM IS SOUNDED


(THE AIR RAID ALARM WILL BE THREE LONG BLASTS ON FIRE SIRENS OR WHISTLES AUGMENTED OF CHURCH BELLS AND THE BLOWING OF POLICE WHISTLES.)

1. OBEY ORDERS OF PROPER OFFICIALS — POLICE — WARDENS
2. KEEP OFF THE STREETS. PARK CARS IMMEDIATELY. SEEK SHELTER AT ONCE. THE SAFEST PLACE IS AT HOME
3. AVOID USING TELEPHONE
4. TURN OFF GAS IN THE HOME
5. FILL BATHTUBS & BUCKETS WITH WATER TO FIGHT FIRES
6. SPRAY WATER ON INCENDIARY BOMBS. DO NOT USE CHEMICALS!
7. IF AT NIGHT, TURN OFF ALL THE LIGHTS
8. FIND OUT NOW WHO YOUR AIR-RAID WARDEN IS
9. REMAIN CALM. ACT DELIBERATELY.


