

GARDEN CLUB NEWS


It is time to get Oriental poppy clumps now, and Madonna lilies and Nankeen, the yellow Madonna lily should be planted as early as they were delivered, so that they can make a good growth by cold weather. They will need some protection the first winter, a few branches of evergreen form the best shelter, as they protect from heavy snow and the winter sun, but do not shut out the air.

THE BUXOM FLOWER ARRANGEMENT CLASS

Mrs. Erhorn gave the club an afternoon of beauty in flower arrangements, giving many hints to help the amateur such as how to lengthen stems too short for the arrangement and how to make a stiff zinnia pliable by inserting fine wire through the center down into the stem. Mrs. Erhorn stressed finding first one beautiful blossom with a graceful stem and making all other flowers in the arrangement subservient to it. The importance of using originality was emphasized in the humbler flowers and even weed which, with imagination, can make charming arrangements.

The fifteen arrangements that were entered by the Shoreham Garden Club were of such high calibre that Mrs. Erhorn had great difficulty in judging first second and third awards. These honors were won by the following-

REGULATIONS FOR BLACK- ING OUT HEADLIGHTS FOR EVERYONE!

Blacked out 3/4 the way down from the top of the light - 3/4 " strip left clear - blacked-out rest of the way down.

The policeman has black paint and will gladly paint your headlights if you are unable to do it yourself.

During a blackout - the 3/4 " by 3 " strip must be covered with red. No one will be allowed to drive during a black-out unless they have official Civilian Defense or Red Cross business.



Place melon on a silver crystal desert dish and serve at the table—the liquid being ladeled out with portions of the flesh into glass cups. 
