

HISTORICALLY SPEAKING

When the town of Brookhaven was divided into school districts in 1815, Shoreham was bounded on the east by Wading River creek and on the south by the "Butt Line". Then, this district was known as Number 35, but was changed to Number 10 in 1842.

In the school census for 1818 the following heads of families were listed: James Woodhull, Richard Robinson, Nathaniel Tuthill, James Woodhull, Benjamin Woodhull, Zophar Mills, David Worth, Henry Hudson, Peter B. and Abraham (no last names listed). There were twenty-six pupils registered in the Shoreham School that year. In 1852 the census showed only twenty-one children, and twenty years later it was about the same, so for many years there was little growth in this area.

In those years cord wood cutting was an important industry through this section of the island, and thousands of cords were cut during the winter months and carted with teams to the bluffs on the Sound where they were loaded on schooners during the summer and

the brickyards up the Hudson at Haverstraw. Schooners came into shore at high tide and "laid on" so that at low tide the teams hauled the wood across the beach and loaded the schooners.

"Loading sloop" was vigorous work as it had to be done before the tide came in, when the sloop or schooner floated again. Many times it was done at night according to the tide. The landing where wood was loaded in Shoreham was known as Woodville Landing.

In the early 1800's Daniel Swezey operated a small store near the landing, (this is now the residence of Mr. and Mrs. Walter O. Cook) which was the headquarters for the men in the cordwood business, and for many years this landing was known as "Swezey's Landing". He was a son of Daniel Swezey of Middle Island, who was active in the Revolution and had to flee to Connecticut to escape capture by the Red Coats during the years Long Island was in the hands of the British soldiers.


The road leading to the landing from Middle Island was opened in 1812, and was called "Corwin's Road" as it started near the home of Reverend Jacob Corwin in Middle Island. He was one of the first ministers of the Wading River Congregational Church shortly before 1800 and was the first minister of the New Village (now Center-reach) Congregational Church in 1818.

The property at Swezey's Landing was in the possession of the Swezey family for many years, and then sold to William B. Dickerson and afterwards acquired by James A. Warden. About the year 1895, he began the developments which later led up to the organization of the Incorporated Village of Shoreham. This village was also



known as Wardencliff for several years.

The first school building in this district stood on Woodville Road near the present village of Shoreham, and was used until after the Civil War, when it was sold and another site secured on North Country Road near the railroad station, and a schoolhouse built. This was used until 1910 when it was destroyed by fire. In 1911 a new building was erected, and school opened in September of that year. This was a modern building for those years. In April 1926 this building was destroyed by fire from an unknown cause. At this time there were only about ten pupils so an emergency classroom was set up in the vestry of the Catholic Chapel.

Shortly after this another site was purchased near the junction of North Country Road and the road leading down to Shoreham Village. Here a picturesque building of Spanish style was erected at a cost of about \$12,000.

The Village of Shoreham nestles on a slope overlooking Long Island Sound, and for many years wealthy and distinguished people have made their summer homes here, including Channing Pollock, the famous playwright and author.

Regulations for the Village of Shoreham

The following set of regulations were adopted by the Village of Shoreham Board of Trustees on May 10, 1965. Because of the rapid growth in population within the Village, some of the facilities available to all Village residents at times seem to be bursting at the seams with their increased use.

Therefore, in order that all may equally enjoy the properties and recreational facilities which the Village of Shoreham provides, the Village Board asks that each citizen use the following list of rules as guidelines.

SUGGESTED REGULATIONS FOR THE USE OF PUBLIC PROPERTIES AND RECREATIONAL FACILITIES OF THE VILLAGE OF SHOREHAM

1. All recreation areas, playing fields, parklands, beach lands, and other public properties and recreational facilities of the Village of Shoreham are maintained and administered for the sole use and enjoyment of residents of the Village.
2. The Recreation Commissioner may, with the approval of the Board of Trustees, from time to time make, publish and enforce such special rules for the use of the Village recreational facilities as may be required, including the designation of footwear, wearing apparel, hours of use or availability, scheduling of games or matches, and in all manner regulate the use of such facilities.
3. Any bona fide house guest of a resident or householder or lessee within the Village may, within the knowledge and the responsibilities of his resident host, use any Village recreational area or facility. House guests are defined as those properly invited guests of residents who reside at a distance greater than two miles from the confines of the Village.
4. Non-residents of the Village may occasionally be invited by residents to accompany and to participate with such resident in sports or other recreational activities which are being held primarily for the benefit and enjoyment of residents of the Village. Such occasional use by non-residents may not be permitted except in the company of the resident host.
5. The use of Village recreational facilities and public properties by guests of residents shall be under the full cognizance

and responsibility of the resident host and he shall be personally responsible for the proper deportment and actions of his guest and shall be personally responsible to the Village for any damage resulting from mis-use, misbehaviour or any willful or malicious act on the part of his guest.

6. Any member of the Board of Trustees of the Village or any other properly authorized officer may, upon observation of or knowledge of any misbehaviour on or mis-use of Village properties, order the instant removal of the offending person or persons. Such incidents are to be reported forthwith to the Board of Trustees for further action or investigation.

7. The Board of Trustee of the Village may from time to time alter, revise, change, or suspend these rules or any portion thereof.
