

Historical Shoreham Newspapers

Shoreham Village is fortunate to have had, since the early 1930's, a series of newspapers that, taken together, provide a contemporaneous, day-to-day look at life in the Village through the years.

The Port Jefferson Echo "announced" the birth of the Shoreham Newspaper on the editorial page of its Thursday edition, July 10, 1930:

"Shoreham's Paper"

"John Haslett, a summer resident of Shoreham and a student of journalism is bringing to Shoreham this week a miniature newspaper and intends to do so each week during the summer. We congratulate Shoreham on having 'arrived' at the point where it can support a newspaper."
