Lost, a Bathing Suit, Sunday, in the Vicinity of Large Raft

One bathing suit was stolen in plain daylight from the back of a Shoreham resident while he was swimming in the vicinity of the big raft late Sunday afternoon, according to reports of the loser, whose name was withheld from the press.

The story of the theft concerns either one or two ruffians who attacked the gentleman in question while he was swimming peacefully by the life rope fifty feet off shore.

A reward is being offered for the return of the bathing suit and a still greater sum of money will be given for evidence and clues leading to the arrest and conviction of the person or persons involved in the crime, it was said.

Sand Shark Reported Seen By Swimmers Off Shore

A reported seven-foot sand shark was seen five hundred feet off Shoreham beach Wednesday afternoon by at least seven people who were in the water and on the beach at the time. First seen, it was fifteen feet from the dory of E. W. Oliver at 5:30 p. m.

The dory was being fastened to the mooring by Vincent Sherman, John Hagenah and Robert Oliver who were returning from a three-days' camping trip, when some bacon was thrown overboard. Immediately a fifteen-inch fin, undoubtedly of a shark, appeared, moving tow-

ard the bacon. A moment later it disappeared but only after the body of the animal had been viewed.

It reappeared several minutes later near the Pallisters' motor boat, and circled about it for nearly five minutes, in full view of persons on the beach. Bathers who report having seen the sand shark include the three campers, Channing Pollock, Eugenie Finn, Herbert Frei, and Robert Hill.

Sight of a shark, possibly the same one seen off Shoreham, was reported last week off Stony Brook. No man-eating shark, however, has ever been seen in these waters.

COMPLETE RAZING OF SHOREHAM INN

Work Was Started Month Ago; View Cleared This Morning

Razing of the old Flavell's Shoreham Inn was completed today with the removal of the last walls of the first floor. Begun almost exactly a month ago, work has been going on continuously every day, with from five to ten men on hand, under Joseph Malduca.

Contrary to former plans, which showed intent not to complete demolition until January, 1931, work was rushed under orders of the Suffolk County Land Company, and, early this morning, the land upon which the old hotel had stood for a hundred and thirty years was cleared to ground level.

Plot to Be Seeded

No statement as to further plans of the Land Company in regard to the site could be obtained up to this afternoon, save for the announcement by Donald Upham, Secretary-treasurer of the concern, that seed would be sown and the plot converted into a lawn.

Disposal of the remaining lumber and other materials taken from the Inn will go on during the next few weeks, until the plot has been entirely cleared of debris, it was stated this afternoon. The time when the entire property will be in a completed state and sodded has not been announced.


